Benefits of Bills 5 and 17

West Grey acknowledges and supports the Ontario government's objectives in Bill 5: Protect Ontario by Unleashing our Economy Act, 2025 and Bill 17: Protect Ontario by Building Faster and Smarter Act, 2025.

- Accelerated Infrastructure Development: Streamlining environmental and planning approvals will help fast-track essential projects.
- Support for Strategic Economic Zones: Bill 5 introduces mechanisms to boost mining and energy sectors, which are vital to Ontario's economy.
- **Housing and Transit Expansion:** Bill 17 facilitates faster development of housing and transit-oriented communities, addressing urgent needs.

Challenges for Rural Municipalities

Despite the benefits, rural municipalities face unique challenges that may hinder full participation in the provincial mandate:

- **Small Tax Base:** Limited financial resources restrict our ability to invest in infrastructure needed to support growth.
- Infrastructure Deficit: West Grey, like many rural communities, faces aging roads and bridges, and lacks the capital to upgrade or expand services.
- Service Delivery Gaps: With reduced development charges and streamlined approvals, municipalities may struggle to fund and deliver essential services.
- Limited Capacity: Rural municipalities often lack the technical and administrative capacity to respond quickly to new development pressures.

Examples of Infrastructure Deficits in Rural Ontario

- Roads: Many rural roads are in poor condition and require resurfacing or reconstruction.
- Bridges: Aging bridge infrastructure poses safety risks and limits connectivity.
- Water/Wastewater Systems: Expansion is needed to support new housing, but funding and capacity are limited.

Our Asks: Supporting Rural Ontario Through Bills 5 and 17

To ensure rural Ontario can contribute meaningfully to provincial goals, we urge the province to commit to an integrated, systems-based approach for collective impact.

- Establish a Rural Infrastructure Fund: Dedicated funding stream to address infrastructure deficits in small municipalities.
- Create a Rural Capacity Support Program: Technical and administrative support for municipalities to manage development pressures.
- Ensure Equitable Access to Development Opportunities: Mechanisms to help rural areas attract and service new developments.
- Engage in Meaningful Consultation: Include rural voices in the design and implementation of regulations under Bills 5 and 17.
- **Support Long-Term Planning:** Help municipalities develop asset management and capital investment plans aligned with provincial goals.
